CPC Update from Aug. 3

During our last CPC meeting, Pastor Tom provided an insightful analogy – did you know that churches are built to resemble upside-down ships sailing through the heavens above? This boat imagery resonated with me, especially when I considered how some of the disciples who were fishermen immediately laid down their nets and followed Jesus without hesitation. This same sense of calling and purpose drove all of us to join the council. I was determined to help steer this ship, believing that with God, Bethesda could overcome any challenge, and failure was never an option.

As a congregation of imperfect individuals aboard this vessel, we have faced hardships, losing dear ones and grappling with uncertainties about our future direction. However, we've also made slow but steady progress towards calmer waters, filled with hope and promise.

Over the past months, the CPC has been working diligently, setting specific goals for the church's betterment. We focused on streamlining the administration, ensuring the church's seamless operation. We conducted our own research and collaborated with Pastor Tom and a volunteer consultant to create a comprehensive job description for the pastor, alongside a structured review process for accountability. And after witnessing Pastor Tom's dedication and passion for growth both personally and as a congregation, we unanimously voted to support him and asked him to stay as our called pastor, a decision he graciously accepted. Tom feels called to be here and we feel he has and will continue to bless many through his work at Bethesda.

So, what does the future hold?

Looking ahead, we are enthusiastic about the future. We want to hear from all of you about what Bethesda's mission and vision should be. We will be seeking your ideas and thoughts, approaching this task with transparency, faith, and a spirit of fun. We will take our time with it, as this is important work, and adjust along the way. 


"Man's Search for Meaning is a 1946 book by Viktor Frankl chronicling his experiences as a prisoner in Nazi concentration camps during World War II. According to a survey conducted by the Book-of-the-Month Club and the Library of Congress, Man's Search for Meaning belongs to a list of "the ten most influential books

in the United States. Left on Tenth by Delia Ephron.


